Message From the Chair

Patricia J. Carter

Dear members and interested readers:

I hope that this message finds you well, and that SOASIST has provided you with personal and professional development opportunities since the last Newsletter issue from November 2001.

In December 2001, I formed a Web Site Committee to plan ways to revamp the SOASIST Web site. Committee members are Ted Baldwin, Glen Horton, Patricia Neff, Elna Saxton, and myself. If you're interested in serving on the Committee, submitting ideas, actually editing/Updating the Web site, or assisting in some other way then please contact me.

In January 2002, I posted a survey on the SOASIST listserv asking for your feedback regarding SOASIST. There was a 23% response rate (compared to a 24% response rate in 2000).

Questions covered what members are looking for in programs, types of programs and topics of most interest, program-planning preferences (day of the week, time, etc.), and what prevents members from attending meetings. Results of the survey indicate an interest in demos of new technologies, engaging speakers, and Information Science topics such as information retrieval, knowledge dissemination, web-enabled databases, and image retrieval/processing. The main reasons why members don't attend meetings is because topics are not of interest and/or conflicts with schedules.

Since January 2002, our planning committee – Glen Horton (Chair), Tim Richison, Connie Godsey Bell, and myself – have worked hard to provide you with programs on timely topics relevant to Library & Information

Science/Studies and Information Technology. So far, we've held programs on handheld computers (January), information privacy (February), and the virtual reference desk (April). Programs being planned for the remainder of the year include a seminar on thesaurus design, a presentation on data mining, co-sponsored events with the Indiana chapter of ASIST and the Miami Valley Computing Societies (on disruptive technologies), our annual business meeting, and a social event.

Both of the student chapters are revitalized, with several students assuming leadership roles. The University of Kentucky - ASIST student chapter has held several programs already this year, and the Ohio virtual student chapter is planning a program or two in the upcoming months.

Announcing: 2002 Student Essay Competition

For the 2nd year in a row, SOASIST is holding an essay-writing competition. The competition encourages students in Library and Information Science programs to consider the benefits of participation in the activities of professional societies. All students enrolled in Library and Information Science programs (who live in Ohio or Kentucky)

are eligible to enter; competitors are required to compose an essay addressing the following question: “What specific benefits do I expect to gain from attending the

ASIST 2002 Annual Meeting?” The winner receives reimbursement funding up to \$1000 for registration, airfare, food, and lodging expenses to attend ASIST 2002: Knowledge, Connections, and Community November 18-21, held at Philadelphia, PA’s Wyndham Franklin Plaza Hotel and a one-year membership in ASIST.

Established at the suggestion of Patricia Carter, Manager – Technical Library and 2002 Chair of SOASIST, this award is being funded by LexisNexis. This is another way in which LexisNexis supports professional library and infor-

mation science associations. And supporting students is a top priority with SOASIST, through programs targeted at students, involvement in the student chapters, and by giving out this award.

TO ENTER: compose an essay that addresses the following question: “What specific benefits do I hope to gain by attending the ASIST 2002 Annual Meeting?” (The Conference theme is described in more detail on the ASIST Web page at: (<http://www.asis.org/am02cfp.html>)). "Thesaurus Design for Semantic Information Management" is the theme of this seminar to be taught by Dr. Bella Hass Weinberg, Professor, Division of Library and Information Science, St. John's University.

The seminar will introduce the design of controlled vocabularies for indexing and searching, covering semantic relationships, thesaurus format, and screen display. Computer-assisted techniques of thesaurus development and natural language search strategies will also be discussed.

Information architects, librarians, indexers, and technical writers should benefit from the seminar. Prior seminars have been rated "excellent" by the vast majority attendees, includ-

ing experienced thesaurus designers. Dr. Weinberg chaired the committee of the National Information Standards Organization that developed the revised American National Standard on thesaurus construction, which was reaffirmed in 1998. She is a Past President of the American Society of Indexers and the recipient of its Hines Award. At St. John's, Professor Weinberg teaches graduate courses in information science, indexing and abstracting, thesaurus design, and information architecture. Dr. Weinberg consults on the design of thesauri and indexes, has done research on thesaurus structure, and publishes extensively on linguistics and information science.

Event Report: 3rd Annual Information Architecture Summit

Sponsored by ASIS&T: "Refining Our Craft" (Baltimore, March 15-17, 2002)

The well organized, well attended, and informative Third Annual Information Architecture Summit sponsored by ASIS&T, "Refining Our Craft," was held March 15-17, 2002 in Baltimore. Presentations and workshops covered information architecture (IA), IA job roles and skills, and striving for definitions; content analysis, facet analysis, metadata, controlled vocabularies, taxonomies, and thesauri; case studies of PeopleSoft, Audi, and other sites; site structure, labels, and

"information scent;" deliverables, user testing, and "findability pain;" and return on investment and ethics. Poster sessions, browsable during breaks and buffets, ranged from studies of wireframes and information flow to bread-crumbs and business requirements.

The summit's theme, "Refining Our Craft," was conveyed by a number of the speakers who defined information architecture, by metaphor, as a craft-based knowledge and skill that produces functional artifacts. Peter Morville, president and founder of Semantic Studios, gave the best short definition of an information architect in

his presentation, New Roles in Information Architecture: "A person passionate about findability." The summit was a superb example of hosting a diverse and articulate community.

The conference organizers, chaired by Andrew Dillon of the University of Texas at Austin, provided ample time for questions, discussions, and lively debates on such matters as whether research findings are helpful or this statement about IA is true: "It's not rocket surgery" - keynote speaker Stephen Krug's company motto.

Events: The student chapter sponsored a three-part career colloquia. For each program, we furnished soda

and chocolate candy, and attendees were invited to bring their lunches.

Feb 14, 2002: "The Nuts & Bolts (& Bits & Bytes) of Being an Electronic Resources Librarian at an Academic Institution", featuring Beth Kraemer, UK's Electronic Resources Librarian. Six students and two faculty attended this program.

Mar 19, 2002: "Working with Websites in Academic Libraries" featuring Rob Aken, UK's WWW Resources Librarian. Seven students and 1 faculty attended.

April 25, 2002: "Getting the Information Across: Communication Skills for New Information Professionals", featuring Suzie Allard, Doctoral Candidate & Chair of SIG-DL. This was originally designed to be a full presentation, but was changed because of light attendance on the

week before final exams. Four students attended, and Suzie elected to talk with each one one-on-one, and answer their particular questions on the topic, including effective job interviews. There was a lot of interest in this topic, but the end of semester crunch prevented interested students from attending, so it was decided that the full presentation would be postponed until the end of August (early in the Fall 2002 semester).

On March 7, the UK SLIS, through Dr. Donald Case, sponsored the annual Lazerow Lecture, featuring Bob Martin of IMLS. The UK Student Chapter was not directly involved in putting on this event, although most of our members did attend.

Future Program Plans:
The Student Chapter does not have any firm plans at this time, however, it is planning to schedule at least two new events in

the fall, offering similar practice-oriented information as the spring colloquia did. In addition, we may schedule a social-type event as well. We won't have any formal events during the two summer school sessions, as experience has shown that summer school students are even more pressed for time than in the regular semester, making it unlikely that events will be well-attended.
Other activities:

Kristiana is working on our updated website, and hopes to have it completed in time for the filing of our annual Student Chapter report on May 31. This report will also serve as our entry for the Student Chapter of the Year award. One of our goals for the upcoming semester is to continue to promote ASIST and become more effective in increasing our membership.
